

GUIDELINES FOR NCS PRIMARY WING:

Messages for parents working with children at home

As public conversations around corona virus disease 2020 (COVID-19) increase, children may worry about themselves, their family, and friends getting ill with COVID-19. Parents, family members, school staff, and other trusted adults can play an important role in helping children make sense of what they hear in a way that is honest, accurate, and minimizes anxiety or fear.

GENERAL PRINCIPLES TO AWARE CHILDREN:

- 1. Remain calm and reassuring.
- 2. Remember that children should follow your guidelines regarding corona-virus precautions. Generally they will pick up cues from the conversations you have with them and with others.
- 3. Make yourself available to listen and to talk.
- 4. Avoid making assumptions about who might have COVID-19.
- 5. Pay attention to what children see or hear on television, radio, or online.
- 6. Consider reducing the amount of screen time focused on COVID-19. Too much information on one topic can lead to anxiety.
- 7. Give children information that is truthful and appropriate for the age and developmental level of the child.
- 8. Talk to children about how some stories on COVID-19 on the Internet and social media may be based on rumors and inaccurate information.
- 9. Teach children everyday actions to reduce the spread of germs.
- 10. Remind children to stay away from people who are coughing or sneezing or sick.
- 11. Remind them to cough or sneeze into a tissue or their elbow, then throw the tissue into the trash or use own handkerchief.
- 12. Discuss any new actions that may be taken at school to help protect children and school staff.
- 13. Get children into a hand washing habit?
- 14. Teach them to wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing their nose, coughing, or sneezing; going to the bathroom; and before eating or preparing food.

- 15.If soap and water are not available, teach them to use hand sanitizer. Supervise young children when they use hand sanitizer to prevent swallowing alcohol, especially in schools and child care facilities.
- 16. Try to keep information simple and remind them that health and school officials are working hard to keep everyone safe and healthy.







Hima Das - The Golden Girl of India

From the guiden paddy tickle of Assam to winning gold on international tracks, this 19-year-old from Assam has made Indians realize their dream. She is also known as India's Dhing Express.

Flima Das was born on 9th lanuary 2000. She is the youngest of the five kids of Jonali Das and Ronjit Das. Hima's parents are rice farmers; she used to run in the muddy rice fields and corner them in fewarooments with lightning speed. Hima wanted to become a footballer; she used to play as striker for local clubs and she was quite good at it.



The two Athletics coaches
Nabuut Malakar and Nipon
Das, book the responsibility
for her training and turned
her life around.



Hima Das was conferred with Arjuna Award at the Rashtrapati Bhavan by President Ram Nath Koyard on September 25, 2018



At the age of 18-years she won 400m gold at the IAAF World Under-20 Athletic Championships by clocking a speed of 51.46s. She is also the first Indian to have won a gold in a track event at the world level.



She is also appointed as Assam's Brand Ambassador for sports by the Government of Assam.



In September 2018, Hima Das signed an endorsemen deal with the international brand Adidas. Her customised shoes bear her name "Hima Das" on the right shoe and "create history" on the left shoe.



In November 2018, Him was appointed as India's first ever youth ambasse of UNICEF-India.

Jungfraujoch is an underground railway station in the region of Switzerland. It is at a height of 3,454 metres above sea level. It is the highest railway station in Europe.







It is one of Japan's most aesthetic station buildings. It is a perfect blend of modern science with a respect for tradition. The most striking feature of this station is its massive wooden gate.

It is situated in Arlington, Texas. It was opened in May 2009, has a capacity of 105,000, including 80,000 seats.




